Dear Parents & Carers,

### **Winter Fete**

Last Friday our community came together for our annual Winter Fete. It was an amazing day and so lovely to see so many parents, carers and visitors. Thank you to all that were able to attend and contribute to our school community. Together we raised \$1606.60. This money will go toward supporting the development of our engaging learning environment to improve our students' learning outcomes.

### **Commonwealth Bank Presentation**

During assembly on Friday, Jackson School were presented with a \$10,000 donation as part of the CBA Centenary Grants from Commonwealth Bank. Following our whole school assembly our local Brimbank Mayor Cr Margaret Giudice visited Jackson School to congratulate us on our CBA donation and look around our school. Thank you once again to Commonwealth Bank for their generous grant.



### **Early School Arrivals**

Many of our students are arriving at school between 8am and 8:30 due to train/bus times and early alarm clocks. We encourage our students to socialise outside of school time but we are unable to offer supervision to your children before 8:45am. Staff are rostered onto yard duty before school from 8:45 until lessons commence. During this time the majority of our students arrive by bus. Can we please request that your child arrives at school after 8:45 for insurance and supervision purposes as school doesn't officially open until this time? We thank you for your support to ensure your child's safety before school.

### **Reports, SSG Parent-Teacher Interviews & ILPs**

Semester 1 reports are currently being finalised by teacher teams and will go home before the end of Term 2. On our return you will have an opportunity to discuss your child's progress and new ILP goals in Week 2 (Wednesday 25th July for Primary & Secondary, Thursday 26th July for Senior Secondary). Letters will be sent home in Week 1 of Term 3 for you to make an appointment with your child's teacher. Semester 2 ILPs will be sent home following our next SSG Parent-Teacher interviews.

### **First Day Back & Pupil Free Curriculum Day**

From 29th June student will be on holiday from school for two weeks. Students will return to school on 16th July at 8:45. On the Friday 20th of Week 1, Term 3 there will be a pupil free curriculum day to allow all staff to undertake Berry Street training. The Berry Street Education Model provides schools with the training, curriculum and strategies to address our engagement of vulnerable or disadvantaged young people so that they can achieve their personal and social potential through educational achievement.

### YEAR 7/8

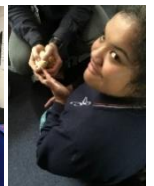

## Senior Secondary News

Students in their final years at Jackson School undertake work experience on a weekly basis. This starts off as structured work experience where a group of students perform structured tasks in a workplace with their peers. As students gain more skills, confidence and independence, this can often lead to independent work placements. This means the student attend a work placement independently and work closely with their employer.

Thana, our work experience coordinator, supports students in finding independent placements, applying, meeting and greeting employers. We have had students placed at Coles, Vinnies, Lazy Moe's and Sunshine Hospital just to name a few.



Pictured is Lachlan at his independent placement at Rebel Sports. His duties include sorting and organising items, cleaning duties, placing items onto shelves and other general duties. The manager has reported Lachlan being "great, hard-working, listens and follows instructions well and very happy with how he is going."

Lachlan says "it's been an amazing experience. The items here are great and the people are very nice here."
