Foreword


The Disability Services Directory is a MetroAccess initiative funded by the Department of Health and Human Services and implemented in partnership with Brimbank City Council.

Disability Liaison Officer

Provides consultancy for the court to assist magistrates in the management of people with disabilities in the sentencing process. The Coordinator advises the court in relation to issues concerning disabilities as they affect the court and identifies service needs of defendants with complexcare demands such as anti-social or challenging behaviours. When a magistrate has concerns about the vulnerability or additional needs of a person in custody, the Disability Coordinator negotiates with prison management regarding the most suitable location, depending on classification. The Disability Coordinator is also able to apply to VCAT on behalf of the Magistrates' Court for the appointment of an administrator or a quardian.

Enforcement Review Office

The Enforcement Review Program (ERP) assists and advises members of the community who have unpaid fines and whose special circumstances demand particular consideration.

ERP applies to outstanding Perin Court infringement notices that are progressing to the enforcement stage. Special circumstances justifying review include diagnosed mental illness, acquired brain injury, intellectual disability and severe physical disability.

If the offender suffers from one of the special circumstances and it is evident that judgment was impaired at the time of the offence, a third party can make an application for revocation of fines. The application for revocation of fines must outline the client's special circumstances including financial capacity, medical diagnosis and compliance with treatment. Medical evidence from the client's treating medical practitioner or psychiatrist and other relevant social factors should also be included.

The service provides offenders with mental illness access to appropriate treatment; identification & assessment of mental health status & fitness to plead; diversion from the criminal justice system; reduction in the frequency & length of custodial remands to obtain psychiatric reports; linking to appropriate mental health facilities in the community or prison system as appropriate; and reassessment of the mental state of offenders with a known psychiatric history. The service consults and networks with mental health services, professional services and family members involved in the offender's care.

Disability Abuse & Neglect Hotline

A referral service that takes reports about people who are using any disability service funded by the Commonwealth or state or territory governments and who may have had their legal or moral rights transgressed though abuse or neglect. Reports are forwarded to appropriate government agencies for investigation. Callers are also referred to other potential avenues of assistance such as complaints resolution agencies and advocacy organisations. Reports can be made by people with disabilities and by their families or carers, by advocates, services staff and health & other professionals. Anonymous reports are accepted and the privacy of people making reports is closely guarded. Advocacy can be arranged for callers with disabilities who require help to make a report.

Centrelink Carer Allowance

The personal care test is related directly to tasks requiring daily attention such as administering medication, eating, food preparation, bathing, hygiene and mobility, but not assistance with domestic chores.
